Wellbeing

Following a comprehensive school self-evaluation process conducted at the end of 2023, the school identified student wellbeing as one of the three main areas of focus in the new 2024 -2027 Strategic Improvement Plan. After a thorough review and consultation with various stakeholders, including parents, teachers, and students, we are pleased to announce the implementation of our newly revised wellbeing and behaviour procedures. This updated framework reflects our ongoing dedication to promoting positive behaviour, resolving conflicts constructively, and supporting the overall wellbeing of our students.

Key highlights of the revised procedures include:

Clear Expectations: We have outlined clear and

consistent behavioural expectations across all areas of school life, from classrooms to playgrounds, to ensure a cohesive and supportive environment for learning.

Proactive Support Systems: Recognising that every student may face challenges at different times, we have enhanced our support systems to provide proactive interventions and resources aimed at addressing individual needs and fostering resilience.

Restorative Practices: Embracing the principles of reflective practices, our updated policy emphasises the importance of repairing harm and restoring relationships when conflicts arise. We believe in fostering empathy, accountability, and reconciliation within our school community.

Collaborative Approach: We value the partnership between home and school in supporting student wellbeing and positive behaviour. As such, we encourage open communication and collaboration between teachers, parents, and students to address any concerns and celebrate successes together.

Continuous Improvement: Our commitment to continuous improvement means that we will regularly review and refine our policies and practices to ensure they remain responsive to the evolving needs of our students and community.

We believe that by implementing these updates, we will further enhance the overall school experience for our students and contribute to their long-term success both inside and outside the classroom.

Where: On school grounds


What: K-2 Cross-Country carnival. Children may wear a t-shirt of their house colour or their sport shirt along with their sport uniform.
